Our membership coordinator will also be moving on at the end of May. Karen Marshall has been the volunteer membership coordinator since 2019. She has seen us through some significant changes and updates over the last year. 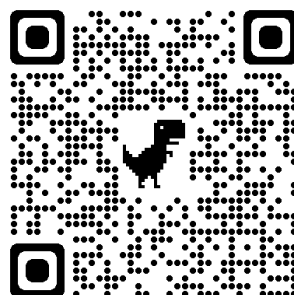

## RBCA offers scholarship

The Richmond Beach Community Association (RBCA) is happy to announce that once again it will be offering a \$500 academic scholarship to high school seniors currently living in the Richmond Beach community. This scholarship program was initiated in 2020; and based on the positive feedback we received, we decided to continue the program.

The scholarship may be applied to the cost of tuition and fees, books or supplies required for courses of instruction at the educational institution chosen by the student. The scholarship will be paid by RBCA directly to the educational institution for the use of the scholarship recipient once enrolled.

Qualified students are those who are planning to pursue full-time continuing education through a technical program, community college or a university in the coming (2022-23) academic year. Family members of RBCA Board members are not eligible for this scholarship.

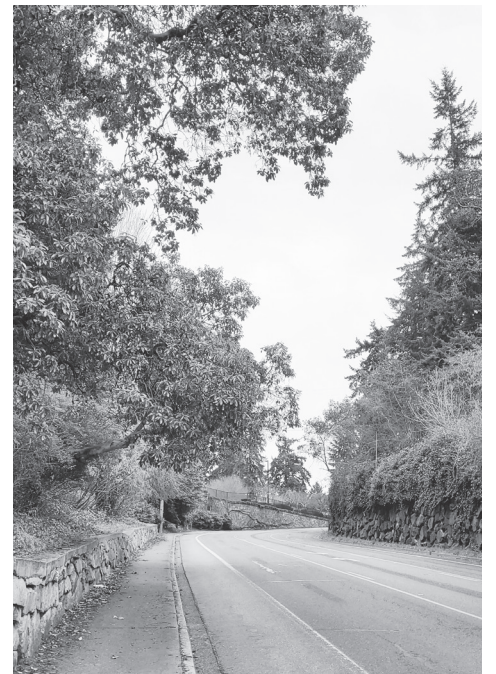

## Wandering Richmond Beach – Part 1 of a 3-part series

I moved back to the Pacific Northwest a year ago after having been gone for 40 years. It's great to be back! I grew up in Mount Vernon, but decided to move to Shoreline to be close to my siblings and their kids. I knew very little about Richmond Beach and figured the best way to get to know it was to tie my laces, put in my earbuds, turn on a crime podcast and start walking. About 10 years ago, I realized that not only did I not enjoy running anymore, but my body was also telling me it was time to find another aerobic exercise. However, I have always preferred being outside to being on the treadmill.

Being from the PNW, I knew that the weather can be unpredictable, so I decided I wasn't going to let rain get in the way of exploring my new home. I bought new outdoor gear that was suitable for walking and hit the road. What I have found has brought miles and hours of fun and discovery. I started thinking that it would have been great if someone had shared this information with me when I arrived, so I decided to share my experience and comments on my favorite routes.

I live near the Richmond Beach Coffee Company, so the first thing I realized is that there are five choices on which way to go, making it hard to run out of options or fall into a rut. I walk for 45-60 minutes, which allows me to explore several different areas and keeps me from getting bored. As a result, I have found something to suit whatever mood I'm in—lots of hills, intense hills, relatively flat, tree cover, etc. Thank goodness most of these routes have wonderfully wide shoulders and bike lanes, which allow me to stay out of the way of cars and other people.

joining in the spring of each year. The easiest way to manage your renewal payment is by authorizing Paypal to set up a recurring, annual payment. Log on to your PayPal account. Under Settings, select Payment Settings, then Preapproved Payments and edit your change to pay on April 1 each year.

**What other sources of income does the RBCA have besides my dues?**

Additional income is raised from newspaper advertising, event sponsorships, grants and donations.

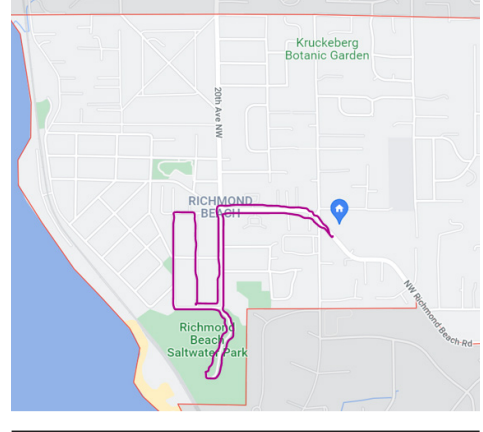


I hope you will give these a try, and maybe I will see you wandering around Richmond Beach!

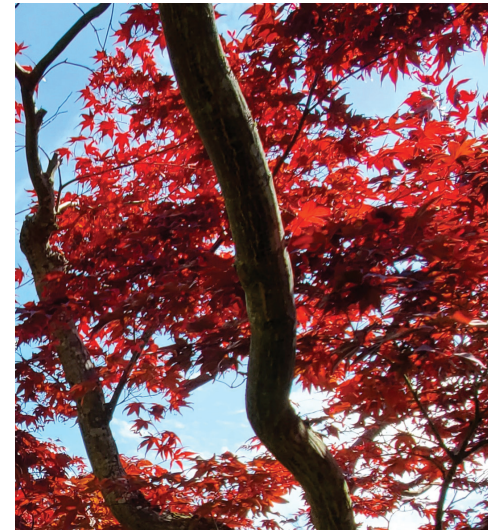

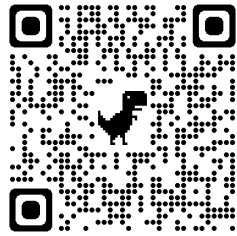
